



Parts of Speech

Adjective

An adjective describes a noun or a pronoun. It tells you what kind, how many, or which one.

Examples: cold, happy, young, little
The little girl has a pink hat.

Preposition

A preposition describes a relationship between a noun or pronoun and another word in the sentence.

Examples: at, on, in, across, beside
I left my keys on the table for you.

Conjunction

A conjunction joins words or sentences together.

Examples: and, yet, but, because
I was hot and tired but I still finished the race.

Interjection

An interjection is a word or phrase that expresses strong feeling or emotion.

Examples: wow! oh no! ouch!
Wow! I passed my exam!

Parts of Speech

Noun

A noun is the name of a person, place, thing or idea.

Examples: Emily, forest, table, joy

Pronoun

A pronoun takes the place of a noun in a sentence.

Examples: I, you, it, they, me, us

Verb

A verb tells what action someone is doing or expresses a state of being.

Examples: run, speak, think,
dream, eat, live

Adverb

An adverb describes a verb, adjective or another adverb. It tells how, when, where, or to what extent.

Examples: slowly, loudly, quickly
I ate my lunch quickly.
