Upon realizing what happened, Dan got out of the car and quickly began searching for others. One of the passengers was still caught in her seat. Without hesitation, Dan climbed back in to save her. In doing so, he got himself stuck and caught fire. His skin was so badly burned that he underwent multiple surgeries. Through stories, laughter, compassion, and companionship, Kate helped him get better during his stay at RMH.

③ Kate says she enjoys volunteering – but more importantly, she likes the laughter and joy it brings to others. “Nothing brightens my day more than to be able to make a difference in someone’s life,” she adds.


